
#### HALLOWEEN PARADE AND ROUTE



# NEIGHBORHOOD BLIGHT, BAR 3606 FINALLY A THING OF THE PAST

After years of neighbors facing crime, noise, shootings and even a murder related to activity at Bar 3606, the bar has closed. The City Plan Commission (CPC) has approved a new Planned Development District driven by input and activism from local residents that will pave the way for more desirable tenants in this stretch of Greenville Avenue.

The plan must next be voted on by Dallas City Council. If Council approves the plan, they can make it effective immediately which LGNA urges is in the best interests of our residents.

The new Planned Development outlines exactly what types of businesses can and cannot exist at this location adjacent to residential properties. It includes:

- No late-night uses. All businesses must close operation to the public by midnight.
- No alcoholic beverage establishments. That means no dance clubs or bars that don't serve food.
- Restaurants must have at least 50% of sales in food items.
- No outdoor amplified sound.
- Any restaurant use must provide a 6-foot sidewalk in front to get a Certificate of Occupancy.
- A cap of 5,000 square feet of restaurant use (to prevent an overflow of cars parked in the neighborhood)

"No plan is perfect when it comes to complicated zoning issues and part of this negotiation process allows the landlord to have 25 fewer required parking spaces than the City's standard regulation would require here, but we feel the trade-off is more than worth getting this bad operator away from the homes of LGNA residents," said LGNA Vice President and tireless advocate for this improvement, Darren Dattalo.

Good things are already in the works following the closure last year of OT Tavern. Foxtrot, a coffee shop and market, has already opened its newest Dallas location in the former space.

### THROW SOME SHADE

### HELP TIETZE PARK LAUNCH THE CENTENNIAL TREE PROJECT WITH YOUR DONATION

Dallas Parks & Recreation has agreed to plant 22 new trees this spring at Tietze Park if area residents can raise the funds needed to install an irrigation system to water the new plants. The Friends of Tietze Park (FOTP) are leading this effort and have already collected 60% of the \$9,500 that must be raised by the end of 2023 to make this project happen.
